# 1. Introduction and Recap of last meeting

- SS Agreement made at last meeting for better standard of roads. Evolved after obtaining data on road numbers.
- MN Communication with Sally Doyle Mayor. She has committed to a meeting with council to address issues.
- NP Julie Collins MP correspondence.
- MN Julie Collins MP correspondence, apology, they are supportive and will send letter to council.
- SPEAKER Tammy Price. Explained about Bicentennial money promised to seal both North Huon & Lonnavale Roads. Signs were up.
- Maintenance vs Capital Investment. Turns the roads into an asset.
- Mark O'May SPEAKER Reiterated that we shouldn't complain to council and that they have no money.

## 2. Agreements and Progress Updates

- SS Detailed analysis of road counter data vs. national guidelines.
- SS Road data obtained, cross referencing with National Best Practice Guidelines. Explanation of guidelines (not law), designed to assist local Govmt to maintain.
- No inspection regime for road standards demonstrated by Council, only when community members complain.

## Item Description

- 'Levels of service' stated in national guidelines. Customer Focus, ride comfort, assembly. 'Technical level of service', speed, roughness.
- 2x more likely to have an accident on unsealed roads.
- SS. Road data obtained. Explained numbers and thresholds outlined in national guidelines.
- SS RESOLUTION The data shows a case for sealing the roads. Resolution made, all attendees in favour of sealing the roads with a vote.

- MN All Councillors emailed. Sally Doyle Apology.
- Responses from most councillors. Supportive.
- Jullie Collins support. Apology.

## 5. Open Discussion Q&A

- Mark O'May reiterated the original promise of heavy vehicle and trucks were to be diverted to forestry roads through Geeveston. Not through Lonnavale & Judbury/North Huon.
- School Bus driver, Tammy, reiterated the amount of damage to school bus. Since January 2x engine mounts, 4 tires & a new door mechanism. Mentioned that this journey is considered a 'heavy journey'.
- Other vehicle damage. \$3000 car damage. \$1000 car damage. New shocks in a 5 year old car.
- Q. As a collective can we deem the road as 'unsafe'. Nature of the material used on the roads to be questioned as it is poor quality.
- Remarks Council using inadequate material on roads. Where is the extra \$2.5m from Fed Gov going?
- Remarks Ken Saville Nth Huon Rd is a transit corridor to Hobart. A Significant road which carries heavy vehicles, residents, school busses. Population growing. A bypass for Huonville etc.
- Remarks What about essential services? Ambulances, Fire, Police? There could be a lengthy delay to assist in emergency with bad quality roads.
- WHS Must be fit for use. Lives/Injury.
- MOTION OF NO CONFIDENCE Derek Smith mentioned duty of care opf Council and their legal obligations. failed to gather support.
- Reiteration of wanting to work co-operatively and collaboratively with Council.

#### 6. Next Steps & Closing Remarks

- Need help with Data Analysis. Encourage more members of NHC.
- Working toward meeting with HVC, and possibly with Kerry Vincent Local MP for roads & infrastructure.
